



## **President's Report**

When I was asked to write the "President's Message" for our first Annual Report for the Amesbury Carriage Museum my initial reaction was "wow", for two main reasons. The first being that for an organization officially in its 31st year this would be our first Annual Report. The second was the impressive thought that I was to represent the organization as its President of the Board and stand in the shoes of so many committed board presidents over the past 31 years. Without the legacy of these past presidents I would not be in this role today. My reaction is fitting, I suppose, for someone serving on the board of a local history museum dedicated to the celebration of its city's industry and people; for we are nothing if not the realization of the hopes and dreams of those that have come before us.

For me, these past three years have been so full of hope. Our most significant achievement in 2016 was the hiring of the museum's first Executive Director, John Mayer. Filling this position has allowed us to begin to professionalize the museum and to take the necessary steps to: develop a strong relationship with the Amesbury school system; to collaborate on curriculum; to build a stronger relationship with our city's governmental leadership; and to continue our work with the Amesbury Chamber of Commerce to foster a climate of collaboration.

A second achievement was the completion of a three year strategic plan for the museum. This exciting work included rewriting our mission and developing a vision for the museum. We now can succinctly state who we are, why we exist, and where we are going, answers so necessary when you want to articulate to someone why they should support us.

A third achievement was broadening our Board membership and inviting in more community leaders with a wide range of skills and knowledge. I am excited about this specifically as it relates to our goal of financial sustainability.

Over the next years we aim to build on our accomplishments. We will need to work to have our community members, residents, and business owners understand and support our purpose. We need to build our educational programs for students and encourage participation from adults to foster ownership and pride in Amesbury's industrial history and its people. We will need to find a permanent home for our collection yet continue to be a "museum without walls."

I am excited about the future and know, that having built a strong foundation, we will achieve those hopes and dreams with your continued support.

# **Executive Director's Report**

In March 2016 I became the Executive Director of the Amesbury Carriage Museum. Working with the Board, we are steadily developing our museum. If I had a dollar for each time I used any of those phrases, our endowment would be overflowing. Slow and steady we go.

We do not lack for direction; the "work" for the Carriage Museum is about building a base of operations able to support engaging history programs for the Amesbury community. In the short time I have been on staff, I am very proud of our accomplishments.

For a small organization, our leadership is strong. Thanks to the Board of Directors I began with clear objectives – establishing committees, creating a budget and plan of work, offering meaningful programs, organizing the collection, learning about Amesbury, our members, and more.

Each initiative has connected me to something special about Amesbury, and I mean this in the truest sense of the word. Beginning with a partnership with the Southern New England Chapter of the Society for Industrial Archaeology, we have created a committee of passionate volunteers who meet monthly. From their focus has come abundant knowledge about industry and worklife in Amesbury. This project is ongoing and will support future exhibits, programs, and much more. Want to learn about Mill 4? – just ask. We can talk for an hour about the building. Curious about the dam on the Powow River? We can help you understand how the flowing water fueled the growth of downtown.

A group of educators shared their passion for teaching local history and their belief in the power of museums – from this came a concept for creating learning materials and a successful application to the Amesbury Education Foundation to fund a curriculum project for Amesbury schools. This will happen in the summer of 2017.

Amesbury Mayor Gray's Car Show in June brought out many helpful volunteers who gave their time to make the show a success. The number of cars on view, the number of visitors in attendance, and the depth of enthusiasm for the event together were unprecedented.

This is our first annual report. As you review our reports, the calendar of events and the lists of members and supporters you will see the community is proud and eager for the museum to succeed. We had a great year in 2016.

Thanks to you all for your support. We cannot do this without you. Here is to a wonderful year in 2017!


